After graduating in 1990 Jane freelanced with the BBC and WNO. She plays regularly with the Welsh Sinfonia and Concert Orchestra de Cymru. Since 1990 Jane has been performing with harpist Eluned Scourfield as Mwynion Mai Flute & Duo. Jane founded CAFÉ

(Cardiff Amateur Flute Ensemble) of which she was Musical Director until 2006. Jane teaches the flute at Howell's School, Cardiff as well as running her own private teaching practice. When not performing or teaching she works with her husband Tim at Creighton's Collection Music Publishers.



BEN CREIGHTON GRIFFITHS, born in Cardiff took up the harp when he was 4, turning professional when he was 18, by which time he had already earned an international reputation, won a number of major international music competitions and performed across the world. ## Monmouthshire **Flute Day**

Have you ever wanted to play your flute with a harpist but never had the opportunity? Come to Wales, home of the harp, and give it a go!

This is the first Monmouthshire flute day to take place in the beautiful market town of Abergavenny, the gateway to Wales, which lies in the shadow of the Black Mountains.

The day will be led by flautists Catherine Handley and Jane Groves who have enjoyed working in Wales for many years with numerous harpists and they will be joined by the talented harpist Ben Creighton Griffiths.

The day will cover both playing in a Flute Ensemble accompanied by Harp and playing in a Flute & Harp **Duo** and is aimed at the amateur adult who enjoys playing in groups, with the added opportunity to play a solo item accompanied by Ben, our professional harpist.
